Key Achievements at the end of July 2023

Areas for further Improvement to begin September 2023

- Continuation of children taking part in inter school competitions/activities
- The school funds transport to and from all events, using a mixture of public transport, private hire cars and mini-bus rentals to ensure there is no expectation of parents being responsible for supplying this which allows the school to be fully inclusive. Teachers are encouraged to run these events and supply is always granted.
- Equipment ordered and replenished which will assist the delivery of good quality PE teaching, running after school events and hosting inter and intra competitions at Manor Field.
- Pupils were again able to attend out of school experiences watching professional sport. A number of pupils had a day out at Sussex Cricket club at one of their first class matches, which included activities and opportunities to take part in workshops. Due to our relationship with Sussex CCC, we obtained complimentary tickets and funded the transport ourselves to reward those children who had attended after school clubs and had been a sports leader during the academic year.
- Investment on high quality posts and nets for football and netball. These
 will last for many years and be able to be frequently used without
 dismantling for winter months. These will be used for PE, break times,
 after school clubs and competitive matches,
- Regular audit and replenish of playground equipment taking on board pupil voice (for example the school ordered a large supply of pogo sticks that the children requested)
- Manor Field refreshed the structure of our after school clubs and paid Teacher assistants, Office Staff and Midday supervisors extra hours to run these clubs (funded by Sports Premium)
- Swimming We continue to prioritise swimming as an important part of the PE curriculum. Over the course of the academic year, all Year 5 pupils have had weekly swimming lessons for at least two full terms. Year 6 top of swim was completed in the Autumn term. Within the timetable, Manor Field sent at least two classes/group swimming at the triangle every week of the academic year.

1. To engage all pupils in regular physical activity – kickstarting healthy

active lifestyles - Manor Field will continue to have swimming at the heart of the upper Key Stage Two curriculum and will provide opportunities beyond the expectations of the National Curriculum. . Continuing from September 2023, both Year 5 classes will swim throughout the year and we will also offer top up swim to those Year Six pupils who cannot yet achieve to swim 25 metres unaided. The swimming lessons we offer will be differentiated by qualified staff, teaching the able more complex strokes and lifesaving skills as well teaching the less able water confidence and basic techniques to swim.

During the year, Manor Field will continually review resources and replace, replenish and freshen equipment that is needed to deliver high quality PE lessons. Manor Field will continue to offer children once weekly Dance lessons by a specialist teacher and be encouraged to run at least two "Mile runs" on a track per week.

(We have continued to have swimming as a priority at a time where national swimming levels are falling, ours are rising. After offering 27 year six children top-up swimm, approximately 80% meet the expectation of swimming 25 metres :independent National average is 42%. We continue to go above and beyond curriculum expectations and offer swimming for year 5 through the whole academic year).

(We have introduced an APP to encourage physical Education, purchased by the school called Bursts. ALL EYFS and KS1 children have access to this. Their results and data are shared with the teachers who can celebrate their success. Cost: £400

2. To raise the profile of PE and sport across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

Manor Field is looking at funding a professional athelete to spend a day in school and inspire children. As well as raising the profile of PE and Sport, this can also be a vehicle for sponsored events to raise money at the same time. (£1000 spent in bringing two Olympic Athletes into school to provide all Manor Field Children with the experience to work with them)

Manor Field will continue to pay non-teaching staff outside of school hours to run an after school Sports club. This was a great success last year, giving more children opportunities than in previous years.

3. To offer a broader experience of a range of sports and activities to all pupils - Manor Field is looking to plan at least two activity days for all children to experience new physical activities that are not taught within our curriculum. We are considering activities such as golf, archery and climbing walls for example. We would be hopeful that this could lead to children taking up new sports and possibly attending clubs after school. Manor Field is also committed to invest in providing outdoor adventure resources such as tent / den building for break times and to use for cross curricular purposes (reading as reading)

Tent building equipment purchased and playground equipment : Spend £500 approx

- 4. To increase participation in competitive sport Manor Field will continue to be a paid member of "Mid Sussex Active" which provides organisation and arrangement of inter-school events as part of their remit. As well as the expected competitions, such as football, cricket, netball and Athletics, Mid Sussex Active run inclusive events for Key Stage One children, SEND and Inactive pupils which Manor Field will continue to attend and fund transportation (as well as releasing teaching staff by booking supply) in order to provide as much inclusiveness as possible. (cover and transport provided for taking part in football, sportshall athletics, rugby and special events for pupil premium and SEND children).So far, Manor field have attended ten events for children across both key stages)
- 5. To increase confidence and knowledge in teaching PE skills Within our membership of Mid Sussex Active, there are CPD opportunities throughout the year for staff to attend. Manor Field intends to provide at least two two staff meetings during the academic year, inviting a trained specialist from Mid Sussex Active to deliver CPD to an area of PE the staff feel that they would benefit most from to improve confidence and knowledge.

Internally, the PE lead will use release time (by booking supply) offering a more personal CPD to those teachers who need support delivering high quality PE lessons through team teaching or assistance with planning.

(We have provided teacher cover and hosted events for CPD, targeting
those early career teachers and those who feel they need CPD in a
subject they do not feel confident in. So far, five members of staff have
attended whole day CPD courses, which are available to use through
<mark>our MSA membership)</mark>
